Fr. Del . . . Points to Ponder

I usually cringe, just a bit, when I remember the famous quote by GK Chesterton, "The Christian ideal has not been tried and found wanting. It has been found difficult and left untried." When I hear the statement, I always wonder how much of the Christian life I have left untried.

Sometimes it's a lot, I'm afraid.

At the risk of overstating the case, I think the same may be true of the Season of Advent. We can be so caught up in the trappings of Christmas that we often miss the richness of the Advent season. You probably noticed, as I did, that retailers were giving birth to Christmas this year in late September.

This is my annual "Let's give Advent a try this year" speech. The Advent season has beauty and subtlety that no other season of the Church year offers us. There are no carols, no candy (except for the Advent countdown calendars), no obligatory parties with colleagues, no competitions for who can give the best gift, and no stress about awkward social situations.

No, if we are really observing Advent, we probably find ourselves spending more time with the Scriptures, especially the prophets. Our home rituals of lighting the candles on a wreath might take precedence. Our prayer might follow the example of Mary's prayer as we sit and ponder in silence, straining to hear the voice of God in the midst of a busy world. Grandparents might consider the gift of new life in the same way Anne and Joachim did as they walked with their daughter as she prepared to give birth. Each of us may use this time to look at our relationships with family, friends, and God.

For various reasons, I have never thought that Christianity is "countercultural." Still, our faith does challenge us to grow in our metaphysical (Beyond what we see and experience) understanding of the Word Made Flesh. We have many opportunities to build silence and prayer into our Advent Season.

- Our St. Mary Magdalene Penance Service on Thursday, December 14, at 7:00 pm at St. Andrew.
- Taizé Prayer (a reflective prayer service of music, Scripture, and silence in candlelight) on Tuesday, December 12, 7:00 pm at St. Veronica.
- Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament scheduled in each of our parishes, and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament whenever our churches are open.
- Consider praying the daily Mass readings at home or attending Mass during the week.

Whatever you choose, let's try Advent this year in a way that we have not in the past. Let's try Advent this year so that we might be prepared fully to celebrate Christmas because we have journeyed with the prophets, Mary, and those who, throughout the ages, have been preparing to meet the Messiah.

As I mentioned last week, I will be out of commission for at least 4-6 weeks. I fell last month, and the only way to get better is to have surgery. I'll be doing some work from home, but not have Masses until I heal enough to do so.

Oh. Now I Get it!

Have you ever thought at Mass, "What in the world is this reading about?" Each week, you can learn some background to make sense of the Scripture for the next Sunday that may be hard to understand.

THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

The 3rd Sunday of Advent is known as Gaudete (rejoice) Sunday, from the first word of the second reading.

Is. 61-2a, 10-11 Jesus repeats these words about Himself in His first synagogue preaching. Originally, they were spoken by the prophet about the liberation from Babylon. In light of Advent, we see them as a proclamation of hope for what the Messiah will come to do. YEAR OF FAVOR: every 50th year, the Jews celebrated a jubilee of thanksgiving in which debts were forgiven and slaves were freed, symbolizing liberation. DAY OF VINDICATION: the day when God will punish His people's enemies. The prophet's joy is rooted in the fact that he and God's people have been raised up and their dignity restored.

1 Thes. 5: 16-24 Paul is giving a summary of how to live in Christ until He comes again. REJOICE ALWAYS: not just positive attitude or emotion, but a stance toward life rooted in the fact that we are loved and saved by Jesus Christ. This overwhelms the crosses of life. GIVE THANKS: tied to the reason for rejoicing. DO NOT QUENCH THE SPIRIT... PROPHETIC UTTERANCES... TEST EVERYTHING: Prophecies spoken by members of the Church were to be taken seriously, but also tested to see if they are truly from the Spirit.

- *Jn. 1: 6-8; 19-28* What we heard last Sunday is now presented from St. John the Evangelist's perspective. John emphasizes that the Baptist:
- a) is sent from God:
- **b**) to reveal the light (Jesus) but that John was not himself the light;
- c) that he is not the Messiah, but one sent to prepare the hearts of God's People for the Messiah's coming;
 d) which he does through baptism with water.
 BETHANY ACROSS THE JORDAN: not to be

confused with Bethany near Jerusalem, the home of Mary, Martha, and Lazarus.






REVERSE ADVENT CALENDAR
