Fr. Del . . . Points to Ponder

Conversion stories, by definition, always involve changing our minds, hearts, and actions. Hopefully, we are self-aware enough to do that by reflecting on our lives. But if we are unable or unwilling, it sometimes

takes another person to alert us to our behavior or attitude. In essence, we serve as prophets for one another, at least when we are mature enough to deal with this kind of direction.

In our first reading today, the prophet Jonah is sent out by God to go to the great city of Nineveh. The people had become wicked and lost their way, so Jonah was the one who stood in their midst so that he could help them see that they were straying. He must have been very persuasive because we see in our brief passage that they changed their minds, hearts, and actions. In a surprising turn of events, God even changed His mind.

This is how relationships work, isn't it? We are never completely "there" but always on the way, at least until we see God face-to-face. The kingdom of God is always at hand, and every day we are reminded to "repent, and believe in the gospel."

My favorite bumper sticker reads: "If you just joined the perfect church, it isn't anymore." As we accompany each other on our faith journey, we need to check our expectations constantly. So many people throw up their hands in frustration and walk away from the church because they have the unrealistic expectation that everyone in the church will be perfect. While this is a wonderful hope, it is not the reality of a people who are both sinful and redeemed.

Pope Francis has reminded us:

"We are all sinners; we have all sinned. By calling (people like) Matthew, Jesus shows sinners that He does not look at their past, social status, or external conventions, but rather, he opens a new future to them... The church is not a community of perfect people, but of disciples on a journey, who follow the Lord because they know they are sinners and in need of his pardon. Thus, Christian life is a school of humility which opens us to grace."

On this side of heaven, we will never graduate from the school of humility, but life is certainly more enjoyable when we try.

Oh, Now I Get it!

"What in the world are next week's readings about?"

Fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Dt 18: 15-20 At this point in the Book of Deuteronomy, Moses is establishing the various ministries for the Israelites. Here he is speaking of prophets, through whom God would speak because the people could not bear to hear God's voice again as they did at Mt. Horeb (aka Sinai), when the Ten Commandments were given. So offensive was it to act as a false prophet, that the offense merited death. After the Babylonian exile, this passage was interpreted by the Jews to refer to only one prophet, for the fulfilment of God's promise: the Messiah.

I Cor 7: 32-35 Because many of the first converts believed that Christ would return in their lifetime (as we heard last week) they wanted to know how to be prepared for His return. Paul recommends, but does not require, that a way to be ready is to live a celibate life, where the concerns of this world are not as many. It would be interesting to know what Paul would say if he knew that Christ would not return immediately.

Mk 1: 21-28 CAPERNAUM: located on the northwest shore of the Sea of Galilee, it is Jesus's adopted hometown. "FOR HE TAUGHT AS ONE HAVING **AUTHORITY AND NOT AS THE SCRIBES."** This does not mean simply that He was a better teacher than the scribes, but that He taught with the authority of God (remember the duty of the prophet from the first reading); the scribes gave their (often well-informed) opinions on the words God had spoken in the past. This was one of the signs of the Messiah in their midst. Jesus, though, is not simply powerful in word, but in action. Unclean spirits and demons are subject to Him, and by speaking His word, they are driven out. Their uncontested rule is ended. Acknowledging Jesus as the Holy One of God is meant to show that they were not caught off-guard about whom He is. Jesus does not want His messianic identity known yet because the people may misinterpret it to be that He is a worldly messiah, not one who is establishing a kingdom not of this world. The people's question is not simply about His actions in and of themselves, but carries the intuitive hope for the Messiah contained in it, even though they barely understand it.

Each year, the Holy Father asks for our prayers for a specific intention each month.

The intention for the month of January is the gift of diversity in the church.

"We pray that the Holy Spirit may help us to recognize the gift of different charisms within the Christian community and to discover the richness of different traditions and rituals in the Catholic Church." USCCB
