



Fr. Del . . . Points to Ponder

Living the life of faith is a risk, yes. Living the life of faith is a calculated risk, absolutely. This is a

distinction with a difference. Salvation History teaches us that there are many variables in life, but for those who put their faith in Christ, there is also one thing that does not change: God's presence is the constant. We may not always *feel* it in our life, but we *believe* it in the deepest part of our being.

The sign that we are taking a calculated risk in living our life of faith is that we are always ready. For what? Ready to meet Christ when He returns at the end of time, but also ready to meet Christ in the events of our daily life.



"Somewhere, and I can't find where, I read about an Eskimo hunter who asked the local missionary priest, "If I did not know about God and sin, would I go to hell? "No," said the priest, "not if you did not know." "Then why," asked the Eskimo earnestly, "did you tell me?"

Sometimes we would rather not know, so then we do not have to be responsible. But because we are a people of the calculated risk, because we are a people who know both our origin and our destiny, we are responsible. Whether God has given us five talents or ten talents, we are responsible to live wisely and ethically.

Paul reminds us that we "are not in darkness," for that day to overtake us like a thief. "For all of you are children of the light and children of day." In other words, both St. Paul and Jesus remind us that we are responsible for the way we live, taking a calculated risk.

As we end this liturgical year, may we be consistent in our desire to do good. Or, as our Opening Prayer this weekend states: *Grant us, we pray, O Lord our God, the constant gladness of being devoted to You, for it is full and lasting happiness to serve with constancy the author of all that is good.*

Oh, Now I Get it!

Have you ever thought at Mass, "What in the world is this reading about?"

Each week, you can learn some background to make sense of the Scripture for the next Sunday that may be hard to understand.

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Is. 63:16-17; 64: 2-7 In these passages, Israel cries out to God, asking Him to bring them back from exile and restore them to His good graces. They acknowledge their sinfulness, but also feel that God let them sin. This seems like irresponsibility on Israel's part, but it is also an acknowledgement of God's power over all creation. They beg God to come to them since He has power beyond their imagining. Because of God's anger at Israel's sinfulness, Israel has nothing good about them, for God has hidden His presence from them. Yet, in all of this, Israel acknowledges that God is their Father; He fashioned them as a potter fashions clay. Despite their utter corruption, they are the work of God's hands. They put their hope in the love of God, which is greater than His justifiable punishment that they have received.

I Cor. 1: 3-9 **GRACE TO YOU AND PEACE:** Gifts only God can give. Paul thanks God for the grace the Corinthians have received that allows them to live in fidelity to Christ while they await His return in glory. God is always true to His word, for He has called them to fellowship – unity – with Christ.

Mk 13: 33-37 Unlike Maria von Trapp, who starts "at the very beginning," the Church starts the liturgical year by looking to the end, to the Lord's return at the end of time. Jesus tells us that His return will come at a time we do not know. He uses the example of a person returning from a trip without warning. The servants cannot afford to be caught unawares, sleeping on the job. So, too, we must always be prepared and ready for the return of the Lord.




REVERSE ADVENT CALENDAR


